

Experience "Peace through Planning" for life's critical moments. Death comes to each of us. Often we have very little forewarning or control over the circumstances of our dving. Planning for these end times is a gentle way of being supportive of our loved ones who, while grieving our dying, must also try to make a peaceful, orderly, and spiritual transition to living without us.

If you or a loved one are facing final illness, death, and funeral planning, or you just want to prepare for that unknown day when you will be called home, ease the burden by picking up a "Peace through Planning" booklet. This guide is available at any time in the parish office and is designed to make the planning for end times a logical step in the life of a responsible and caring adult.

You can continue to wear your hearing aid with the device if you prefer. You will need to provide your name and phone number for us.

If you or someone you know has difficulty approaching the altar to receive communion, please notify an usher as he/ she assists those in your row to the communion procession. A Minister of Holy Communion will be happy to come to you with the Eucharist.
