

WORLD-RENOWNED MUSICIAN TONY MELEND LIVE IN CONCERT

AUGUST 19-20-21, 2023

Tony generates hope and a commitment to help bring people's hearts toward Jesus Christ. Knowing how important life is, he strongly believes in justice and living with dignity!

On September 15, 1987, Tony Melendez played his guitar for Pope John Paul II in Los Angeles. Born without arms, he performed "Never Be The Same." When the Pope approached him from the stage to kiss him in appreciation, it seemed to reflect the sentiments of the entire country.

Tony was born without arms because his mother was prescribed thalidomide a drug used to help calm morning sickness during her pregnancy. He was brought to the Los Angeles area from Nicaragua to be fitted with artificial arms. He wore them until he was ten, when he disposed of them. "I didn't feel comfortable," Tony explains, "I could use my feet so much more." Tony has traveled across the United States and forty foreign countries and making countless television appearances. He has performed at The World Series and sang the National Anthem. "A Gift of Hope," published in 1989, by Harper and Row is his best-selling autobiography. Tony and his wife reside in Branson, Missouri.
