

What the King Asks of Us

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. Jesus' description of the judgment of the nations, which is found only in the Gospel of Matthew, is a powerful reminder of our duty as Christians. It is not a parable, but a prophetic discourse, and it is a message of love and mercy. Jesus is telling us that all the rituals and structures of our Church, however meaningful and beautiful they might be, are meaningless if we don't take care of the hungry and thirsty, the stranger, the destitute, the sick, and the prisoner. What strikes me most about this discourse is Jesus' description of the reaction of the righteous, those who will be saved. They are completely surprised that they did anything special! They weren't seeking reward; they were living as Christ taught them. Caring for others in need was part of their nature, it required no extra thought or effort. As we enter into the season of Advent, a good question to meditate on is: "Are mercy and charity part of my nature; am I imitating Christ in my life?"


