

Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

The readings this weekend focus on the virtue of humility. In today's mediasaturated culture, humility often gets a bad name as a weakness. YouTube and socalled "reality" television have exacerbated the human tendency towards selfpromotion, and Internet blogging allows everybody to be a self-proclaimed expert on everything. But humility is not a weakness; it's a cure for what ails us. The Catechism calls humility "the foundation of prayer." In order to experience God, we must step out of the way. Humility starts with letting go of our pride and our possessions. It centers on recognizing God as the source of all gifts, and it is shown by placing the needs of others before our own. During Mass, as the chalice is prepared at the altar by the priest or deacon, he says this prayer on behalf of the entire congregation, "By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ, who humbled himself to share in our humanity." Christ humbled himself for our sake. May we find the courage through the Holy Spirit to empty ourselves of our pride, greed, and fear in order to share in the divinity of Christ by imitating him in our service to one another, especially the weakest members of our communities.
